Thank you for the opportunity to comment. We write in support of the comments and questions from the Weantinoge Heritage Land Trust.

In 2010-2011, Rivers Alliance supported the integration of state energy programs with the then Department of Environmental Protection to create DEEP. We also support rapid development of solar power. Clean energy leads to cleaner waters.

Unfortunately this project is sited in a highly sensitive environmental area, and the stormwater plan poses clear risks to the state's waters and obligate species. We are familiar with the work and credentials of Paul Elconin at Weantinoge, and rely on his technical analysis. We have been asked many times before to comment on this project, and are glad now to have the benefit of science-based observations that coincide with the concerns of so many in the community and, actually, around the state. This would be an ideal situation in which to bring both energy policy and environmental protection into the permitting process. Both should be joined at the very outset of such projects or the nearest opportunity thereafter.
